Paramedic / CCP

The Paramedic provides exceptional patient care and customer service in the provision of basic and advanced life support care. The Paramedic may be called to drive ambulances. The Paramedic must maintain their Paramedic license and must provide care in accordance with MD Protocols. The Paramedic reports to the clinical manager, but is accountable to direction of the dispatcher. The Paramedic is not a supervisor, per se, but they may be placed in a supervisory position on some medical incidents, in accordance with MD Protocol and medical direction.

This can be full or part-time, and it is a non-exempt position.

The CCP, or Critical Care Paramedic, is an SCT-Credentialed Paramedic. Their duties are consistent with that of a Paramedic, but they have the additional capability of functioning as the SCT provider in accordance with MD Protocol.

CRT-I

The CRT-I provides exceptional patient care and customer service in the provision of basic and advanced life support care. The CRT-I may be called to drive ambulances. The CRT-I must maintain their CRT-I certification and must provide care in accordance with MD Protocols. The CRT-I reports to the clinical manager, but is accountable to direction of the dispatcher. The CRT-I is not a supervisor, per se, but they may be placed in a supervisory position on some medical incidents, in accordance with MD Protocol and medical direction.

This can be full or part-time, and it is a non-exempt position.
